Today's Venue

98 senior golfers from the greater Jacksonville area teed it up today at the Eagle Landing Golf Club for the 259th match in the Senior Men's Interclub series.

Three huzzahs to Orange Park's co-representatives, Mac

McKernan and Joe Pierce, and the Eagle Landing head golf professional, Josh Heinzman PGA, for coordinating today's event. Joe and Eagle Landing's assistant professional, Shane Altizer (I-r) delivered pre-round announcements in front of the staging area outside Eagle Landing's golf shop before launching 52 carts to their starting tees between 8:50 am and 8:52 am.



Thanks to Eagle Landing's clubhouse staff for giving us top-notch service under the direction of their General Manager, Jim Hahn; Food & Beverage Manager, Joe Halisko Williams; and Executive Chef, Bryan Nickels.

Game Day Setting

It was a typically mild, early-springtime day on the First Coast, for moving a golf ball across a well manicured landscape. Kudos to the course superintendent, Allen Slaughter CGCS, and his grounds crew for keeping the fairways, rough, hazards, and greens in pristine, verdant condition.

Today's layout yielded six eagles and 87 birdies while forcing 35 pickups. Eagle production set an all-time record, breaking the four-eagle day at Marsh Landing in September 2008. Birdie production was 16th highest in league history—Deerwood allowed 122 birdies in January 2008; Ponte Vedra Inn kept us to 26 birdies in December 2010.

By eagling holes 7 and 10 today, Phil Grosnick DC added another line to the list (below) of all-time SMI records, tying the record set by Lee Fields DC on June 4, 2018.



Today's Competition

In our monthly event, we compete to determine the top three teams on the day; each of the winning teams' players receives a golf-shop merchandise certificate. In addition, for each par-3 hole, the player who lands closest to the flagstick receives a sleeve of golf balls.

Charting today's scores against those made in March at San Jose (below) suggests today's course, although 234 yards longer, was somewhat easier. While 54 percent of the players at San Jose beat their handicaps, 68 percent of the players at Eagle Landing measured up. Said another way, the average player at San Jose scored 37.8 points and 1.7 strokes less than a bogey player while the average player at Eagle Landing scored 39.1 points and 3.2 strokes less than a bogey player. 48 players reduced their indexes by shooting good scores while 24 players

padded their indexes for upcoming events by shooting relatively poor scores.



Today's Leaderboard

The following table compares the order of finish in our previous event to the order of finish today. In first place, Marsh Landing catapulted from last place in March to edge Palencia by two points.

Compared to last month, seven teams rose and seven teams fell with Jacksonville sliding from third place last month to finish in 12th place.

Team Leaders

Generally, we say a big gun is someone who helps his team into one of the top three places by scoring at least 36 points. Why 36 points? That marks the line where a player overcomes 2:1 odds. 58 players crossed that threshold today; 20 of those were on the prize-winning teams. When that many players cross the 36-point cutline, you can scratch your head or look for an underlying cause.

On the flip side, we observe that the seventh player on each team averages 29 points, which corresponds to 1:4 odds. Today, only four players scored 29 points or less.

Toughest Holes

On average we record 92 pickups at each event. Today's course drew 35 pickups, the 30th easiest day of 146 recorded events. In comparison, we recorded 26 pickups at Eagle Harbor in 2006 and 31 pickups at Osprey Cove in 2016; the all-time high, 225 pickups, was set at Ponte Vedra Inn on December 10, 2010. Today, holes 2, 5, 10, and 11, the four easiest holes, drew no pickups, while hole 4, the 2nd toughest hole, tallied the most pickups, 5.

Scorer's Table

The first card was returned to the scorer's table at 1:30 pm which is five minutes earlier than standard. After processing 26 cards, it was plain: I had to abort the scoring operation. As DeVincenzo said in 1968, "What a stupido I am."

I mistakenly loaded an untested version of our scoring app; it lacked one essential line of code. The intended version was tested on March 28 in a training session witnessed by four league officers. Here's a brief recitation of how this happened.

On April 1, my HP Photosmart 5520 printer went south: its blackink inlet clogged and wouldn't free up after several days of trying. On April 5, I replaced it with an HP Envy 5055 printer which has a quirk that didn't suit our scorecard printing app. It cut me off at the pass with this message:

HP 5055 Display. Paper Size Mismatch

The paper size detected by the printer does not match the paper size selected for the print job.

Our scorecard printing app is programmed to print on a virtual 8.5"x11" sheet while the paper-width guides are adjusted inward to our 3.25"-wide Minuteman Press blanks. For three days, I struggled unsuccessfully to reprogram our app to print over the MMP blanks with specific game-day data. Using a one-step backup program, 104 home-brew cards were printed at the last minute, two to a sheet, and cut by me...imperfectly as it happens, but it was late and my eyes were tired. In a panic, I loaded the wrong version of the scoring app. End of story. After loading the tested app at home, 18 cards were diverted for exception handling and the operator evaluated 21 scores due to marker's errors: five were unmarked and 16 had more than one response. Historically, an average of 31 cards are ejected for exception handling; the least number of cards ejected was 8, the largest number was 87. Generally, higher numbers are due to hard pencils supplied by the course or overly wide cards issued by the league.

Performance Forecast

Since November 2016, we have predicted the order of finish for each SMI match. Make of it what you will but our record is at least as accurate as the annual Punxsutawney Phil forecast. It certainly beats odds makers in Las Vegas and handicappers at the Orange Park Kennel Club.

This month, the forecast model performed a good deal better than last month. While the rank correlation (rho) between the forecast and actual rankings at San Jose was very weak (-0.03), the rank correlation today was stronger (+0.22). In fact, it was slightly stronger than the correlation between the rankings at post time and the finish of this year's Kentucky Derby (+0.19).
