110 senior golfers from the greater Jacksonville area teed it up today on the Slammer & Squire Course at the World Golf Village for the 260th match in the Senior Men's Interclub series.

Three huzzahs to our World Golf club representative, Bob McBride, and the Slammer & Squire's head golf professional, Aric Zuberbier PGA, for coordinating today's event and delivering pre-round announcements (*I-r*) in front of the starter's hut outside the Slammer & Squire's golf shop before launching 56 carts to their starting tees between 8:21 am and 8:23 am.

Game Day Setting

It was a typically mild, late-springtime day on the First Coast, for moving a golf ball across a well manicured landscape. Kudos to the course superintendent, Brad Stephens CGCS, and his grounds crew for keeping the fairways, rough, hazards, and greens in pristine, verdant condition.

Today's layout yielded one eagle and 85 birdies while forcing 45 pickups. Birdie production was 17th highest in league history-Deerwood allowed 122 birdies in January 2008; Ponte Vedra Inn kept us to 26 birdies in December 2010.

- And returning after an eight-year absence, Bob Burke from Jacksonville.


Plus two gentlemen earned a hearty round of applause for their milestone rounds:

Today's Competition

In our monthly event, we compete to determine the top three teams on the day; each of the winning teams' players receives a golf-shop merchandise certificate. In addition, for each par-3 hole, the player who lands closest to the flagstick receives a sleeve of golf balls.

Charting today's scores against those made in April at Eagle Landing (below) suggests today's course, although 183 yards shorter, was somewhat harder. While 68 percent of the players at Eagle Landing exceeded their handicaps, only 49 percent of the players at the Slammer & Squire measured up. Said another way, the average player at Eagle Landing scored 39.1 points and 3.2 strokes less than a bogey player while the average player at Slammer & Squire scored 37.3 points and 0.1 strokes less than a bogey player. 23 players reduced their indexes by shooting good scores while 27 players padded their indexes for upcoming events by shooting relatively poor scores.



Today's Leaderboards

The following tables gameday compare the and season standings at the completion of our previous event to their respective orders of finish today. In first place for the day's match, Deercreek catapulted from 8th place in April to edge San Jose and Queen's Harbour by three points. San Jose won the 2nd place tiebreaker by six points over the back nine. World Golf Village failed to capitalize on the home advantage, finishing four points back in 4th place. Compared to last month, seven teams rose and six teams fell with Orange Park sliding from third place last month to finish in 11th place.

In first place for the season, the top three teams maintained their positions while San Jose displaced Hidden Hills for 4th place. In summary, four teams rose and three teams fell this month with Hidden Hills dropping four places.

Last month at Eagle Landing, thirteen teams exceeded the odds of scoring its team points. This month, eight teams exceeded the odds. Ideally, we'd expect to see seven teams beat the odds and seven teams lose to the odds.

Team Leaders

Generally, we say a big gun is someone who helps his team into one of the top three places by scoring at least 36 points. Why 36 points? That generally marks the line where a player overcomes 2:1 odds. 55 players crossed that threshold today; 19 of those were on the prize-winning teams. When that many players cross the 36-point cutline, you can scratch your head or look for an underlying cause.

On the flip side, we observe that the seventh player on each team averages 29 points, which corresponds to 1:4 odds. Today, only four players scored 29 points or less.

Toughest Holes

On average we record 92 pickups at each event. Today's course drew 45 pickups, the 11th easiest day of 148 recorded events. In comparison, we recorded 26 pickups at Eagle Harbor in 2006 and 31 pickups at Osprey Cove in 2016; the all-time high, 225 pickups, was set at Ponte Vedra Inn on December 10, 2010. Today, hole 9, the third easiest hole, drew no pickups, while hole 11, the 5th easiest hole, tallied the most pickups, 7.

Scorer's Table

The first card was returned to the scorer's table at 12:58 pm which is two minutes later than standard. The last card was scanned 57 minutes later at which time the scoring operation was closed and the winners' prizes distributed.

We distributed 56 yellow pencils; 18 were returned to the scorecard box. In the following table, 15 of the blank responses determined to be false; clearly visible marks were were presumably made with unauthorized (hard) pencils.

In league history, an average of 29 cards were ejected for exception handling; the least number of cards ejected was 3, the largest number was 88. Generally, higher numbers are due to hard pencils supplied by the course or overly wide cards issued by the league.

Pace of Play


Coming into this match, our scorecard proxy model predicted the fastest group would finish in 4h 26m from starting tee to ending green. In fact, Group 11B was the fastest, finishing in 4h 11m. Congratulations to our pace-of-play rabbits: Lee Ashburn PA, Mark Dalziel SG, Bruce MacDonald QH, and Rick McFarlin HH.

At the other extreme, today's turtles took 39 minutes longer to play the same course—we're still working to understand how that can happen.

Performance Forecast

Since November 2016, we have predicted the order of finish for each SMI match. Make of it what you will but our record is at least as accurate as the annual Punxsutawney Phil forecast. It certainly beats odds makers in Las Vegas and handicappers at the Orange Park Kennel Club.

This month, the forecast model performed a good deal better than last month. While the rank correlation (ρ) between the forecast and actual rankings at Eagle Landing was weak (+0.22), the rank correlation today was moderate (+0.53). In fact, both values were stronger than the correlation between the rankings at post time and finish this year's Kentucky Derby (+0.17). That result may have been thrown out of whack when the stewards disqualified Maximum Security for swerving into the paths of War of Will and Long Range Toddy.
